Tip! For news outlets that do not have English news coverage, google chrome has an automatic translation function. You can [add the extension](#) to your chrome browser. Once you do, a little pop-up window right underneath the address bar will appear any time you visit a non-English website giving you the option to translate the page to English. Once you click on English, google magically translates all text on the website to English. The more common the language is, the better the translation.

Tip! For newspapers that restrict the number of news articles to read for free, try browsing in incognito mode to circumvent the limits.

YouTube

YouTube is a treasure trove when it comes to accessing news stories and perspectives from non-Western or non-American parts of the world. Below is a list of YouTube channels that I frequently use in classes. Many news outlets such as DW (Deutsche Welle) or Al Jazeera also offer documentaries of various lengths (20 minutes to over an hour). Of course, this is not an exhaustive list and reflects my research and teaching

interests. If you want to recommend other YouTube channels, please email APSA educate so we can add to the list!

Tip! on YouTube, search for “International News” and then filter results by channel. This gives you a list of news outlets that cover international news as well as non-American news outlets.

Tip! Many international newspapers also have YouTube Channels – please reference the newspaper list above for ideas.

Non-US centric outlets:

1. [Arte.TV Documentaries](#) – French/German tv channel that explores global issues in documentary form (short and long form as well as mini-series).
2. [BBC World Service](#) – global BBC coverage from a British perspective
3. [Deutsche Welle](#) – International arm of German public broadcasting. Has a variety of content including news stories, analyses, breaking news reports, documentaries on Germany, Europe, and the World.
4. [France 24](#) – French news channel bringing a French perspective on (world) politics. As DW, has a variety of short and long-form news reports as well as documentaries.
5. [EuroNews](#) and [Euractiv](#) – covers news and issues in Europe with a special focus on the European Union
6. [ABC News](#) (Australia) – news on Australia and Australian perspective on global issues and politics
7. [Global News](#) - news on Canada and Canadian perspective on global issues and politics

Majority World:

1. [Al-Jazeera](#) – based in Qatar, Al-Jazeera offers broad coverage on global issues. They particularly excel at full-length documentaries and their series “Inside Story” is a good discussion starter.
2. [AllAfrica](#) – is a pan-African news source covering current events on the continent.
3. [AfricaNews](#) – is a pan-African news source covering current events and country-specific politics.
4. [CNA](#) – based in Singapore, this news channel covers current global events from an Asian perspective.
5. [WION](#) – The World Is One News is based out of New Delhi, India and provides in-depth coverage of global news and developments.
